Antitrust Compliance Policy

It shall be the policy of the Association to be in strict compliance with all Federal and State Antitrust laws, rules and regulations. Therefore:

- 1. These policies and procedures apply to all membership, board, committee and other meetings of the Association, and all meetings attended by representatives of the Association.
- 2. Discussions of prices or price levels is prohibited. In addition, no discussion is permitted of any elements of a company's operations which might influence price such as:
 - a. Cost of operations, supplies, labor or services;
 - b. Allowance for discounts:
 - c. Terms of sale including credit arrangements; and,
 - d. Profit margins and mark ups provided this limitation shall not extend to discussions of methods of operation, maintenance, and similar matters in which cost or efficiency is merely incidental.
- 3. It is a violation of Antitrust laws to agree not to compete, therefore, discussions of division of territories or customers or limitations on the nature of business carried on or products sold are not permitted.
- 4. Boycotts in any form are unlawful. Discussion relating to boycotts is prohibited, including discussions about blacklisting or unfavorable reports about particular companies including their financial situation.
- 5. It is the Association's policy that all meetings attended by representatives of the Association where discussion can border on an area of antitrust sensitivity, the Association's representative request that the discussion be stopped and ask that the request be made a part of the minutes of the meeting being attended. If others continue such discussion, the Association's representative should excuse himself from the meeting and request that the minutes show that he left the meeting at that point and why he left. Any such instances should be reported immediately to the President and staff of the Association.
- 6. It is the Association's policy that a copy of these Antitrust Compliance Policies and Procedures be given to each officer, director, committee member, official representative of member companies and Association Management Company (AMC) employees annually and that the same be read or understood at all meetings of the membership of the Association. A copy of this policy will be included in every meeting agenda packet.

Robert's Rules of Order Quick Reference Sheet

Robert's Rules can be confusing to people who have never encountered it before. However, it is the most efficient way to handle business at a large meeting. Robert's Rules of Order protects the rights of the majority, of the minority, of individual members, of absentees, and all of these together.

The following points and chart should cover all you need to know to effectively participate during a meeting.

- Only voting delegates may make motions or vote on motions.
- Non-voting delegates may participate in the debate on a motion.
- State your name and the Chapter you represent (also add that you are a non-voting delegate, if necessary) when speaking or making a motion.
- Stand in line at one of the microphones to obtain the floor.
- You do not need to obtain the floor to second a motion or to make one of the motions that allow you to interrupt the speaker (although the chair may ask you to go to a microphone).
- Attempts to use point of order, point of information, or parliamentary inquiry to participate in the debate will be ruled out of order.
- Address your comments to the chair and not to another member (don't directly engage in debate with another member).
- An amendment to a motion may be amended, but an amendment to an amendment to a motion may not!

Chapter Representatives Committee Orientation Packet

Welcome to the Chapter Representatives Committee, or Chapter Reps for short. Whether you volunteered or went to the bathroom at the wrong times, we're excited to have you join the Committee and know you will have a great time, learn a variety of information to take back to your chapters and shops, and meet wonderful people that want to help you personally and professionally.

As a Chapter Rep, you will be responsible for representing your chapter at the state level of ASCCA, but also relaying the information gained from the Committee meetings and Team Weekend events back to your chapter. As you being your journey at the state level of ASCCA, this packet will help you understand and acclimate to the role of the Chapter Rep.

Chapter Representative's Job Description (from the ASCCA Chapter Manual)

Each ASCCA chapter board appoints a Chapter Representative to attend every meeting, both state and local. Chapter boards should also appoint and make known an alternate in case the Chapter Representative is unable to attend a meeting. Chapter Representatives have a flexible term ultimately determined by the individual chapters although it is recommended that chapter representatives commit to a minimum of a two-year term.

The recommended career progression for a Chapter Representative is a minimum of two years as a member of the chapter and having held a leadership position on the Chapter Board. Many chapters have their Past President in this position. Further advancement is up to the individual but many Chapter Representatives eventually serve on the ASCCA Board of Directors. However, they may not serve as a Chapter Representative and a member of the State Board unless these is a compelling and necessary reason for them to do so.

Purpose: To represent the Chapter and serve as a conduit of information between the Chapter and the association.

Tasks and Responsibilities:

- 1. Get the ASCCA message to the members by sharing what we are doing at the state level.
- 2. Communicate in both directions with the Association and Chapter.
- 3. Share the benefits of being a member of ASCCA.
- 4. Help promote partners.
- 5. Devekop a Committee onboarding process: ASCCA Policies, Chapter Manual, Treasurer's Tax Manual.
- 6. Chapter Rep Committee Chairman picks up the phone and talks to each Rep, quarterly at a minimum and reports back on the conversations (that they happened and quality) to the Board.
- 7. Use staff provided Team Weekend summary to present to the Chapter board.

Specific Responsibilities that fall to Chapter Representatives include:

- 1. Attendance at all meetings: Chapter Representatives meetings, special meetings and chapter board meetings, ASCCA Board of Directors' meetings.
- 2. After attending Chapter Representatives Committee meetings, the Chapter Representative will provide their chapter board and chapter members with a report on the meeting.
- 3. The Chapter Representative communicates the following: chapter issues to the ASCCA Board of Directors and/or the state office; ASCCA Board of Directors and/or state office issues to the chapter; and issues, concerns, successes, ideas with other chapter representatives.
- 4. The Chapter Representative stays informed about all issues that will impact their chapter members including current activities regarding government relations, membership issues or endorsed benefit providers and can act as a resource to individual chapter members who may have questions regarding any of those/
- 5. The Chapter Representative disseminates information to their chapter boards, newsletter editors, members, and also contributes to state office communications as needed.

- 6. The Chapter Representative will vote on issues on their chapter's behalf and as part of the Chapter Representatives Committee as a whole.
- 7. The Chapter Representative will contribute to ongoing projects identified in the Long Range Strategic Plan in a positive manner.
- 8. The Chapter Representative will be involved with membership recruitment and retention at the chapter level.

In order to support the Chapter Representatives development, the ASCCA Staff will assist in coordinating:

- 1. A yearly orientation.
- 2. Encouragement of the "buddy system" pairing a veteran chapter representative with a newcomer in order to show them the ropes.

Misconduct is identified as the following:

- 1. Consistent non-attendance at meetings.
- 2. Not fulfilling responsibilities.
- 3. Not fulfulling chapter directives including voting contrary to the position of the chapter board on issues.

Misconduct will be addressed in the following manner:

- 1. Attendance will be monitored by the Chapter Representatives Committee and those not in attenance will be reported to the Chapter President by the 2nd Vice President.
- 2. Further action will be the responsibility of the individual chapter.

Chapter Affiliation Agreement Revised January 2018

	This Agreement is entered into as of this	day of	, 20
Betwee	en the Automotive Service Councils of Ca	lifornia, a California no	nprofit mutual benefit
corpora	ation (ASCCA) and undersigned (Chapter	with respect to the foll	owing:

- A. ASCCA is the preeminent professional trade association of independent repair garage owners in the State of California whose overall purpose is to advance and protect the industry.
- B. The Chapter represents ASCCA members primarily in the geographical area described below within the State of California and desires to be chartered by ASCCA as its exclusive Chapter within that geographical area subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- 1. <u>Charter</u>. ASCCA grants to Chapter the exclusive charter to operate as an ASCCA Chapter in the geographical territory as recommended by the Chapters Representatives Committee and approved by the ASCCA Board of Directors (Attachment A). This grant shall become effective (or continued) as of the date of this Agreement and shall continue until suspended or terminated as provided below.
- 2. Name. ASCCA licenses the use of its name to the Chapter for the purpose of using the ASCCA name in conformance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement, provided Chapter shall adopt, or continue in use, "Automotive Service Councils of California, [followed by the name of the Chapter]" in the manner stated in Attachment A ("Chapter name"). The Chapter shall refer to itself by the Chapter name in the conduct of its affairs and shall avoid any inference that it is acting under the authority of ASCCA unless specifically authorized by ASCCA to do so in writing. The license of the use of the ASCCA name as provided in this Agreement shall be effective as of the date of this Agreement and shall continue until it is suspended or terminated as provided below.
- 3. <u>Logo</u>. ASCCA licenses the use of its logo to the Chapter for the purpose of identifying itself as a chapter of ASCCA in conformance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement and in accordance to Article VIII: Use of Association Name, Section: 8-01. The license of the use of the ASCCA logo shall be effective as of the date of this Agreement and shall continue until it is suspended or terminated as provided below.
- **4.** <u>ASCCA Membership</u>. All members of the Chapter shall be members in good standing of the ASCCA.
- **5.** <u>Leadership</u>. Chapter Board members shall be ASCCA members in good standing; committee members are not required to be ASCCA members.
- **6.** <u>Standards.</u> The Chapter shall conform its activities to the purposes of ASCCA as expressed in the ASCCA Bylaws, Policies, and Code of Ethics as amended from time to time, and as established by the ASCCA Board. The ASCCA Board may pass resolutions which also apply to the Chapter and the Chapter shall conform its activities to meet the standards of such resolutions.

- 7. <u>Minimum Membership</u>. The Chapter must maintain a minimum membership in accordance with policy 3-2 New Chapter Formation and Minimum Requirement of an Existing Chapter as established by the ASCCA Board of Directors.
- **8.** <u>Incorporation</u>. The Chapter shall be organized and operated as a separate, independent corporation, as required by State law, with its own tax identification number.
- 9. Respective Authority. The parties are independent corporations. Neither party shall have the authority to direct or control the other except as specifically provided in this Agreement. Neither party shall have the authority to bind the other except as specifically provided in this Agreement. No partnership or joint venture is created by this Agreement.
- **10.** <u>Dues.</u> The respective responsibility of ASCCA and the Chapter for dues collection is described in policy number 2-14, *Collection and Payment of Membership Dues*, as established by the Board of Directors.
- 11. <u>Insurance</u>. ASCCA shall procure insurance in the following general coverage areas that it deems appropriate as to the terms and conditions of each policy and that will specifically name the Chapter as an insured: comprehensive general liability insurance or its equivalent and association professional liability insurance (directors and officers liability insurance) or its equivalent. ASCCA may revise the policies at any time, provided it shall give the Chapter adequate notice. The Chapter will be responsible for determining whether those policies are adequate for the Chapter's particular needs. The Chapter may obtain other or additional insurance as it deems appropriate.
- 12. <u>Indemnification</u>. Each party shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other against any claim arising from the negligence or willful misconduct of the indemnifying party, its agents and employees in the performance of its own activities.
- 13. <u>Programs, Activities and Materials</u>. The parties shall make reasonable efforts to avoid conflicts with the scheduling of significant events. ASCCA and the Chapter shall exchange educational and informational materials produced by each upon request.
- 14. <u>Program Providers</u>. Both parties agree that providing benefits at both the state and chapter level is not only beneficial but desirable for the member. ASCCA partners with reliable companies to enhance the benefit of membership and revenue to the association to support its effectiveness. Program Providers may be endorsed vendors, corporate sponsors and or benefit providers, as defined in Policy 2-19, *Association Program Partner Definitions*. Chapters should participate in joint program development and revenue sharing, as defined in Policy 3-5A, *Chapter / Association Joint Corporate Partner Program*.
- **15.** <u>Chapter Access by Program Providers</u>. A benefit offered to ASCCA Program Providers is access to members. Chapters are encouraged to highlight the benefits of the ASCCA Program Providers when they attend local meetings. Program Providers will participate at chapter events, at the chapter applicable member rate. Participation shall be coordinated to cause minimal inconvenience to the Chapter.
- 16. Records and Reports. After consultation with the chapter, ASCCA may require such records and reports of the chapter as it deems reasonably necessary to establish that the

chapter is conforming to the terms of this Agreement. Upon reasonable notice to the chapter, ASCCA may inspect and copy those records.

- 17. <u>Confidential Information</u>. Each party shall maintain the confidentiality of all confidential and proprietary information and data, including membership lists ("Confidential Information") of the other party. Each party shall also take all reasonable steps to ensure that no use, by themselves or by any third parties, shall be made of the other party's Confidential Information without the other party's consent. Each party's Confidential Information shall remain the property of that party and shall be considered to be furnished in confidence to the other party when necessary under the terms of this Agreement.
- 18. <u>Contracting</u>. The Chapter Board shall specify those persons authorized to enter into Chapter agreements; such persons shall be advised to avoid any impression that ASCCA is any away involved or liable for performance of the agreement.
- 19. <u>Tax Matters</u>. The Chapter is encouraged to adopt the same accounting year as that of ASCCA. The Chapter is solely responsible for preparation and filing of its own tax returns and other legal filings as required by law, regardless of whether the Chapter has a separate tax exemption or is exempt under ASCCA's Group Exemption. The Chapter agrees to provide ASCCA a copy of its annual return within 30 days of filing. By Acceptance of the affiliation agreement the Chapter acknowledges its responsibility for filing its own tax return.
- **20.** <u>Suspension or Termination</u>. ASCCA retains the right to suspend or terminate this Agreement and any of the benefits conferred under it to the Chapter based on a majority vote of the ASCCA Board of Directors that the Chapter has substantially breached any of the provisions of this Agreement or has or is taking actions prejudicial to the interests of ASCCA. A Chapter may terminate this Agreement for any or no reason by a 2/3 vote of its entire membership. Should this agreement be terminated, the Chapter must immediately cease usage of any and all ASCCA identifiers and return all ASCCA property within 10 days. All members will remain members of ASCCA despite any dissolution of the Chapter.
- **21.** Review and Revisions. This Agreement shall be reviewed on the first day of December of the year this Agreement is entered into and every two years thereafter on December 1. This Agreement may be revised or amended at any time, but only by a written document executed by both parties.
- 21. <u>Dispute Resolution</u>. In the event of any dispute or controversy arising out of this Agreement, the parties agree to first submit all issues to mediation under the procedures of the American Arbitration Association. In the event that mediation fails to resolve all issues, the parties shall submit all remaining issues to arbitration under the procedures of the American Arbitration Association; the prevailing party shall be entitled to reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses in accordance with those procedures. The venue of the mediation or arbitration shall be Sacramento, CA.
- **23.** Controlling Law. This Agreement shall be controlled and governed by the laws of the State of California.

OVERVIEW

The financial statements are based on the Board approved 2020 budget. ASCCA uses the accrual method of accounting for financial reporting.

The operations of ASCCA for the Period Ending July 31, 2020 resulted in excess revenue over/(under) expenses of \$64,604 which is less than budget by \$33,711 after taxes.

The following statements are provided for Period Ending July 31, 2020:

- (1) ASCCA Consolidated Statement of Financial Position
- (2) ASCCA Consolidated Statement of Functional Activities

CONSOLIDATO STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL POSITION

CURRENT ASSETS:

Cash: All funds are kept in interest-bearing accounts whenever possible. Total cash balance for this reporting period is \$632,885 of which \$504,644 is being held in the Sage Point Financial reserve account.

Investment Accounts (Vanguard): ASCCA operating investment policy calls for six months of operating reserves. Six months based on the current 2020 budget would be \$180,782 (\$30,130 monthly). Currently ASCCA has total cash in operating of \$632,885 less total current liabilities of \$30,708 a balance of \$62,177 which is ~20 months of operating expenses. Realized gain/loss on investments is currently \$(6,840) less than budget by \$32,969.

FIXED ASSETS:

Building & Fixtures: No fixed assets have been added.

OTHER ASSETS:

Prepaid Expenses: Prepaid expenses are \$3,698. Projects in Progress: Projects in progress are zero.

Future Tax Benefits: MBI's tax benefit which the CPA will review each year to ensure is correct.

CURRENT LIABILITIES:

Accounts Payable: Balance of Accounts Payable is \$8,343. Accounts Payable MBI: (Estimated 2019 tax payments) \$323.

Other liabilities include: Advocacy Fund Contribution, currently the balance \$8,960.

Connect Cars Committee Designated Fund, currently at \$4,405.

Chapter Dues Payable: currently the balance is \$8,677.

LONG TERM LIABILITIES:

Tenant Lease Deposit: \$3,138 (increased from \$1,611.00 by \$1,527.00)

MEMBERS' EQUITY: Includes Capital Stock, Additional Paid in Capital, Retained Earning prior years and current year retained earnings.

CONSOLIDATED STATEMENT OF FUNCTIONAL ACTIVITIES

REVENUES: Total revenue is \$263,093 less than budget by \$66,615 (the revenue includes realized gain/loss of (6,840 on investments)

Membership Dues: Currently dues are \$181,546 less than budget by \$12,617.

Endorsements/Services: Revenue is \$29,653 less than budget by \$6,097.

Connected Car Committee: Revenue is zero, less than budget by \$3,000.

Corporate Partners: Revenue is at \$32,013 less than budget by \$14,654.

Team Weekend Raffle: Revenue is at \$10, less than budget by \$1,240

Other Revenue: (includes miscellaneous revenue and building rental) Revenue \$26,712, same as budget.



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ASCCA RESEARCH & FINDINGS: GUIDANCE FOR COMMUNICATIONS & OUTREACH INITIATIVES

AUGUST 28, 2020

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Overview

KP has conducted a review and analysis of ASCCA communication materials and tactics, and put together a series of observations, key findings and recommendations for moving forward with improving communications, strengthening branding, and growing membership. Throughout the course of our research, we did the following:

- Compiled and reviewed communication and outreach materials from ASCCA state and chapter outreach.
- Held interviews and discussions with ASCCA committee members.
- Conducted a "deep dive" launch session with selected ASCCA leaders
- Reviewed results from the past ASCCA member survey.
- Reviewed and analyzed ASCCA state and chapter social media channels.
- Reviewed and analyzed ASCCA state and chapter websites.
- Called non-ASCCA members for input.
- Reached out to industry associations in other states regarding their communications efforts.
- Reviewed best practices for marketing/messaging/branding considerations.

Based on this research, we were able to get a solid understanding of the types of communication practices and materials in use by ASSCA, identify areas of strength and focus in on areas for improvement, and develop recommendations to guide new outreach efforts moving forward.

The information in this document will be used to guide the development of new materials, creation of new templates with branding/visual updates, and outline systems for marketing and outreach aimed at strengthening the association's communications and positioning it for growth.

General Observations

Overall ASCCA is an impressive association with a lot to offer its members. It has a strong network of experts and information available to help repair shop owners improve their businesses and save both time and money. We want to get people excited about joining ASCCA – helping them see that they will benefit personally and professionally – because people want to get involved in things they are excited about. A part of building that excitement will involve using "WIIFM" (what's in it for me) messaging – that frames the information as how the participant will benefit or what they will learn versus what the association is offering generally. Another part of building excitement about ASCCA is to highlight how the association is the path to a successful future, and show positive visuals and graphics that quickly leave that impression. Too much text, dense documents, or outdated materials make it harder for someone to get excited or be engaged with the association. The value is there, and now ASCCA can take the steps to ensure its communication efforts effectively showcase that value, build excitement and engagement, and point people to the benefits and tools they need most.

Communicating quickly and clearly what the association benefits are will help break through clutter in people's inboxes and feeds. ASCCA offers so many different things – it's hard to know which benefits people need at which time. Keeping communications simple, focusing on categories of benefits, and highlighting those that are consistently cited as highly valuable can help draw in your audience. Not every piece of communication from ASCCA has to tell the whole ASCCA story – different graphics, posts or eblasts can zero in on an individual benefit or specific event. For example, TeamTalk is a major ASCCA benefit to promote – a proprietary tool that ASCCA already offers, something that members who use it appreciate – so this should be promoted more prominently and leveraged more frequently.

We have heard that key barriers to joining for non-members include limited time and limited money – and yet, ASCCA can help members get MORE time and MORE money. Association materials should underscore that fundamental value.

Additionally, the future is upon us, whether a repair shop owner is ready or not. The auto repair industry is changing as car technology is rapidly advancing, and ASCCA aims to be the go-to resource for repair shops to increase their understanding and business capabilities in addressing these changing needs. Through educational webinars, available resources, and connection to networking/chats/meetings – ASCCA can position members to be best prepared to address ADAS needs and other challenges of the future.

In this way, ASCCA strives to be seen as future-focused, and the path for members to improve their future business operations – but the "look" and motto of the association haven't caught up yet. The design of ASCCA materials is dated, and the tagline included with the ASCCA logo directly mentions an era-past: "Professionals in Automotive Service – Since 1940" – which makes viewers think of history/tradition/old ways, rather than innovation/speed/technology. A variety of our recommendations will help address the need to modernize the branding and tone of the association to match its "future-focused" member benefits and offerings.

We have also found that ASCCA has complicated structure that can be either helpful or confusing to existing or potential members. The state chapters came first, followed by the birth of the state umbrella association – we understand the importance of state chapters as well as

why they are each different and unique in their offerings. However, this creates a disparate and uneven member experience for ASCCA. We believe that a stronger top-down communications program will help create uniformity, and not only help strengthen ASCCA's state communications but also position the chapters to be more effective in their own activities. We believe it is in the association's long-term interest to put in place some basic tools and strategies to help unify the chapters and state association – cascading out common branding, messaging, and materials across the state. This should include providing tools to "plug and play" for the chapters that are less active – making it easier for them to raise the caliber of their localized communications and outreach programs. This will also help with creating a strong statewide brand and give ASCCA a competitive advantage.

Key Recommendations

Based on the above information and our understanding of where the association wants to head, we believe there are four key recommendations that should guide ASCCA marketing and communications.

Modernization: Be Future-Focused

- Modernize the look and feel of the association's core materials show a modern brand to reflect the goals of ASCCA helping its members modernize and be prepared for the future.
 - Portraying an association that is future-focused and tech savvy will help demonstrate relevance for younger business owners and the future of the industry.
 - Create updated templates for fact sheets, flyers, brochures, social graphics, newsletters and other outreach materials.
- Capitalize on association activities that are preparing owners to provide services "of the future".
 - Leverage and promote the work of the Connected Cars Committee they are
 offering case studies/lessons/advocacy to position auto repair shop owners to
 effectively use technology and provide the repair services that will be needed in
 the coming years.
- Consider updated association systems to reflect a modernized brand.
 - ASCCA would benefit from an updated website that not only has a more modern feel, but also functions in a more modern way.
 - The ASCCA website should serve as the association hub with chapter subpages organized and housed on the main state website rather than sitting as stand-alone pages with completely different styles.
 - The ASCCA website should include online event registration, member database info, membership sign up and payments.

Consistency: Create Greater Uniformity Among Chapters

- Create more uniformity for the chapter structure and chapter communications
 - Provide chapters with templates for events and resources that use the same ASCCA branding.
 - Provide a framework for suggested outreach and communications practices that can be executed on the local level by chapters.
 - This can include monthly events and newsletter content.
- Consider joint billing with the state association to demonstrate coordination.
- Fold chapter websites into the main ASCCA website.

Systems-Based Approach: Implement a Multi-Pronged Communications Program

• Systems produce outcomes – so ASCCA will benefit from a systematic and sustained effort to communicate with members and non-members. There is no immediate silver

bullet solution to increase membership, but over time the continued use of various tools and tactics will position the association for long-term growth and success.

- We recommend a 3-pronged communications approach
 - Chapter level outreach through events/networking/creation of social media ambassadors to spread the word
 - 2. State level umbrella communications about association benefits/events/value
 - 3. State level digital outreach through social media (paid ads)
- 1) Chapter level outreach
 - It is important to leverage volunteer membership in marketing and recruitment efforts – but this must be done in a sustainable way. We recommend providing chapters with a sort of guidebook for member/peer outreach that includes a recommended calendar of activities and the materials to support those activities.
 - Peer-to-peer outreach is very effective for recruiting members and increasing engagement – but it is time-consuming and has a ceiling on what can be expected of volunteer member outreach – that's why this peer-to-peer outreach must be supported by digital outreach from the state level.
 - We suggest creating a bigger pool of ASCCA representatives who are part of the recruitment effort and see it as part of their role.
- 2) State level communications general association information and events
 - We recommend creating an annual marketing calendar to guide the top-down distribution of information about member benefits – this should help ensure sustained implementation of systematic outreach. The calendar can include themes for social media and newsletter content, state level events, local events, membership drives, and key membership checkup points.
 - If someone joins on at the state level only they can then get exposed to the chapter representatives and localized chapter activities, making them more likely to join their local chapter too.
- 3) State level digital outreach/ paid digital ads
 - Social media is a great space to help amplify ASCCA's voice but we first need to strengthen ASCCA's social presence and increase engagement.
 - We recommend assigning ASCCA leaders at the state and local levels as social media ambassadors to help increase social media engagement and over time increase the strength of ASCCA's brand and social messaging over time.
 - It takes a shift in attitudes to get people to be more active on social media

 so ASCCA should consider making it a more formalized responsibility
 for ASCCA leaders so the network becomes more robust and better able to serve as a megaphone.
 - We recommend marketing through flights of paid ads a small budget can be aimed at a highly targeted audience with a highly targeted message.
 - Paid digital ads are far more cost effective than mass mailings.
 - Paid digital ads are can expand the association's reach to prospective members.
 - Paid digital ads can aid the association in building a strong brand identify.

Accessibility: Make it Easier to Tap into the Right ASCCA Resources at the Right Time

- ASCCA has a large library of resources and a valuable portal to information through its TeamTalk channel – the challenge is that it may be hard for members to quickly find the information that is needed or relevant at the right time.
 - We recommend adding a search feature if possible on the website to sort information by topic; streamline and reorganize the website structure to make it easier for a member to find what they need or for a prospective member to understand the education and resource benefits the association offers.
 - We recommend prominently promoting the TeamTalk channel on the website as a way for members to seek out information and get answers in real time. This can also serve as a key marketing tactic for prospective members.
- ASCCA communications should be written through the lens of the member on the receiving end, rather through the lens of the association delivering a product or service.
- Go digital.
 - o To attract diverse and younger members use more email/digital outreach.
 - o Highlight easy and quick access to tools and resources that save time.
 - Showcase how the association helps businesses with digital services focus on technology.

Message Framework & Value Proposition

Proposed Value Proposition

ASCCA is the vehicle to help you improve your repair shop operations today, saving you time AND money – while positioning your shop and the industry for long-term growth and success tomorrow.

Key Messages

- Access to Information:
 - Auto repair shop owners wear many hats and ASCCA will give you information and tools to be a successful small business owner. ASCCA's free legal consultations, business management advice, HR services, industry education and access to business supplies and services can all make your job easier and your business more profitable.
- Positioning you for the Future:
 - The industry landscape is changing and auto repair needs are evolving ASCCA will help you navigate these changes, understand new vehicle systems, and adopt technologies into your business so you are best prepared to serve your customers moving forward.
- Accessible Network:
 - ASCCA members represent a wealth of information and experience through the TeamTalk online forum, webinars, local chapter events, and state-level

events you can tap into a large network for advice and insights to improve your skill set and business.

- Fighting for the Industry:
 - Doing business in California comes with countless challenges ASCCA will help shape state laws and regulations to minimize their impacts on auto repair shops and make them work in the real-world.

Branding Observations

The brand and logo appear dated and inconsistent with how the association wants to frame its current image and value. Based on a review of association benefits and member experience, and discussions with ASCCA leaders, the following key words held the most significance for the ASCCA brand:

- 1. Future-focused
- 2. Community / network
- 3. Access to valuable information / education
- 4. Defense of the industry against government threats
- 5. Pathway for business growth

These words will help guide the content development and materials creation moving forward.

Observations on Existing Brand and Logo

- Tone/ content
 - The tone of the ASCCA website and materials feels corporate, dense, and information heavy. Simplifying the messages and using more action-oriented language could make the association feel more exciting and accessible.
 - o There is limited use of visuals or photos, especially of members.
 - Red and blue colors are striking and classic.
- The logo looks dated and is inconsistent with the theme and focus of the association today. The tagline that accompanies the logo: "Professionals in Automotive Service ~ since 1940" is a blatant reference to "the old days" and doesn't effectively communicate how ASCCA is future-focused and preparing its members for the future challenges and opportunities facing their industry.
 - It is likely that younger members don't want historical expertise, they want access to expertise and learnings on current and future issues for auto repair and the industry.
 - The tagline and link to website make the logo look bulky and is unnecessary.
- Many similar associations across the country have outdated websites, so an update would help position ASCCA as an industry leader.
- Feels out-of-touch with evolving industry there is little to showcase the association's emphasis on technology and the future.
- Outside of main site (state), chapter sites are inconsistent with the state site and there
 are no indicators that they connected to a larger organization.

 The website should serve as a welcoming and information entry point for prospective members – yet it is hard to get the feel through the website for the connected membership or statewide network.

Considerations to Guide Rebranding and Development of New Materials

Imagery

 Include high-resolution photos, especially of members. Images should be of diverse auto repair shop owners and technicians, happy customers, and give the feeling of satisfaction from good service.

o Include visuals of individuals in classes, training, or interacting with one another

to highlight the benefits of membership through imagery.

 ASCCSA is for all shop owners: young, new, seasoned professionals, men, women, gender-neutral, Black, white, Asian, Latino, Middle Eastern, etc.
 Visuals must reflect the kind of diverse membership you want.

Tone

- Create a feel that is: sleek, modern, and up to date. Create a tone that is: motivating, inspiring, accessible (not overwhelming).
- Stick with general palette of red, blue, and white colors to maintain historical consistency; however, make the colors, visuals and graphics more modern -consider how colors influence us emotionally.
- Modernize the existing logo using a more modern font and omitting the "Professionals in..." and web URL.
- Consider incorporating an icon into logo. Whether the shape of a car, an outline of the state of California, an easily recognizable tool, etc.
- Cascade out the new logo through all ASCCA and chapter materials to increase uniformity.

Diversity & Inclusion

California is the one of the most diverse states in the nation with its diversity ever-growing. As a statewide organization in California, ASCCA has an opportunity to develop an organization-wide plan for equity, inclusion, and diversity. It may address: 1) increasing diversity in ASCCA leadership, 2) increasing diversity in ASCCA membership, and 3) supporting workforce development of a diverse pipeline of future auto repair techs and shop owners.

ASCCA must assess diversity among its current membership and any existing programs aimed at diversity and inclusion. If no programs exist, we suggest developing a diversity and inclusion task force that can help refine the approach for chapter and state leaders. They can help identify areas within association recruitment, events, and structure that could be tailored to more purposely include members of diverse backgrounds.

Additionally, ASCCA should work to develop written materials, training resources, social media posts, events and newsletters that reflect a commitment to inclusion and visually show diverse populations. By creating visuals and materials that model the association's goals for inclusion and diversity, the association creates a more welcoming organization.

Over the spring and summer, many businesses, non-profits, and associations all put out statements about racial justice and diversity – but some received backlash for issuing statements without making any real improvements – "But is the support of the business community performative or have they really done the work? Investing in diversity, equity, inclusion and justice work is significant because it requires a multi-layered approach. Racism can be internalized, interpersonal, institutional and structural all at the same time." We don't recommend ASCCA simply post a statement online about diversity – there should instead be actions to back up that sentiment and commitment.

Key Recommendations

- Establish diversity and inclusion task force that provides recommendations for increasing diversity through membership growth and leadership recruitment within the existing membership. Activities can be implemented at the state and local level.
- Assess member demographics and areas of opportunities to increase diverse membership.
- Create opportunities to engage non-members and develop resources specific to diverse shop owners.
- Engage third-party community partners that focus on women and ethnic groups and establish relationships with partners for co-hosting events.
 - Work with ethnic chambers or community groups on initiatives aimed at preparing the auto tech workforce pipeline.
 - Engage nonprofits as partners for job training initiatives Urban League, local workforce boards, local community colleges, etc.
- Consider a mentoring program for potential members of all backgrounds.



Virtual Conference Environment



The virtual booth allows attendees to investigate vendor products and services, view demos, pick up literature and white papers, and even engage in discussions with a company representative.


Visitors may "drop their card" electronically to get into a drawing a
