Robert's Rules of Order Quick Reference Sheet

Robert's Rules can be confusing to people who have never encountered it before. However, it is the most efficient way to handle business at a large meeting. Robert's Rules of Order protects the rights of the majority, of the minority, of individual members, of absentees, and all of these together.

The following points and chart should cover all you need to know to effectively participate during a meeting.

- Only voting delegates may make motions or vote on motions.
- Non-voting delegates may participate in the debate on a motion.
- State your name and the Chapter you represent (also add that you are a non-voting delegate, if necessary) when speaking or making a motion.
- Stand in line at one of the microphones to obtain the floor.
- You do not need to obtain the floor to second a motion or to make one of the motions that allow you to interrupt the speaker (although the chair may ask you to go to a microphone).
- Attempts to use point of order, point of information, or parliamentary inquiry to participate in the debate will be ruled out of order.
- Address your comments to the chair and not to another member (don't directly engage in debate with another member).
- An amendment to a motion may be amended, but an amendment to an amendment to a motion may not!

- I. Call to Order
 - D. Kusa called the meeting to order at 2:01 pm.
- II. Roll Call / Attendance Record

- III. December 21, 2017 Meeting Minutes
 - D. Kusa presented the minutes of the December 21, 2017 meeting that were approved by consent.
- IV. Committee Financial Update
 - a. 2018 Approved Budget –G. Peterson presented the approved budget that incorporated the Committee's request to increase the NASTF travel by \$1,000.
- V. National Automotive Service Task Force (NASTF) Update

C. Johnson – Reported that Donny Seyfer is the new Executive Director of NASTF. Donny has been placing on the NASTF website any service information site alerts. He noted that Jaguar's service information site is down, Chrysler's had been down for three days and that General Motors (GM) is extending the service information subscription. C. Johnson reported that NASTF publishes a manufacturer of the month to acknowledge the manufacturer's cooperation. He further reported that the Lock Smith Identification (LSID) Vehicle Security Professionals (VSP) site is being referenced by law enforcement to determine if stolen vehicle keys are being produced.

There are three scan tool sites, OEM.com, NASTF and the Automotive Service Association (ASA).

- a. NASTF Team Reports
 - C. Johnson reported that the NASTF Teams have not met since December. He noted that there are a few meetings scheduled.
- VI. Society of Automotive Engineers (SAE) Committee Update
 - C. Johnson reported that there is nothing new to report, as the changes to the data link security protocol is still being reworked. $_{23}$

VII. Action Sheet

- a. Legislative Bill Report J. Molodanof reminded everyone that this is a new legislative year with approximately 2,600 bills anticipated to be introduced. He reported that presently two bills stand out, as follows:
 - AB 1743 (O'Donnell), California Career Technical Education Incentive Grant Program, which has been set for hearing February 7. J. Molodanof and G. Hritz will participate in the hearing. It was recommended by both that ASCCA should support the bill; and,
 - AB 1745 Only Zero Emissions Vehicles after Jan 1, 2040.
- J. Molodanof reported on two carryover bills on ASCCA's radar. The first bill AB 5 (oppose) would have required employers to offer additional hours before hiring someone new. This bill died in committee. AB 1679 (oppose) Motor vehicle insurance: auto body repair also died in committee; however, the author is likely to reintroduce it.
- J. Molodanof reminded the Committee that the Legislative deadline to introduce new bills is February 16.
- b. Oil change regulations ASCCA should raise this issue during the Bureau of Automotive Repair (BAR) sunset review process. BAR is attempting to do something about the minor repair and unlicensed activity via regulatory changes; however, the issue will likely need to be addressed through legislation.
- c. California Vehicle Inspection System (Cal-VISTA) It was reported that the BAR is working through a request for proposal (RFP) process to identify a new vendor.
- d. BAR Complaint Allegations, Trends, & Unlicensed Enforcement Activity J. Molodanof reviewed the recent consumer complaint trends reported by the BAR.
- e. CSBA J. Justus reported that the California Small Business Association (CSBA) are currently reviewing legislation and that ASCCA will look to areas that we can coordinate efforts with CSBA. He will continue to keep the Committee updated.
- f. Lead Acid Battery Fee and Windshield Remove from action sheet.
- g. Telematics It was reported that Telematics will continue to remain on the Action Sheet; however, it is uncertain whether legislation will be introduced.
- Mobile ARD Advertising Regulations These regulations are in effect. Members of the Committee were encouraged to be on the lookout if there are mobile repairs not meeting the requirements.
- i. BAR-97 Specification J. Molodanof reminded the Committee that the draft regulations are in circulation and that he is seeking the Committee's input.
- j. Electronic Documents and Authorization J. Molodanof reported that the BAR continues to work on this regulation package noting that once completed, the amendments will be a huge improvement towards modernize the authorization process. He anticipates the new regulations should take effect the second quarter of 2018.
- k. Brake and Lamp T. Renee noted that there was a questionnaire recently sent out to the brake and lamp adjusters.
- I. STAR Program Cleanup This effort is still in progress.

m. Certified Training Institutions and Instructors – BAR is still working on this draft regulation package. J. Molodanof noted that the regulation amendment has gone through a long process that has been in the works for five years.

VIII. New Business

- a. ACTION Item Follow-up There was a question about the status of sending information on the House of Representatives, which was an action item from the last Committee meeting.
 - ACTION D. Kusa and G. Peterson will get together to get the House of Representatives information sent.
- b. Connected Cars Committee (CCC) G. Peterson reported that the CCC will be sending an update to the membership next week.

The "Ad-Hoc HAV Data Access Coalition" strongly supports Section 15 of S. 1885, the "American Vision for Safer Transportation through Advancement of Revolutionary Technologies Act," ("AV START Act"), as reported favorably from the Senate Commerce Committee. We urge that Section 15 – a bipartisan amendment originally authored by Senator Jim Inhofe (R-OK) and incorporated into S. 1885 at the Senate Commerce Committee's mark-up of S. 1885 by unanimous consent -- be included in any highly autonomous vehicle (HAV) legislation agreed to by the House and Senate through a formal or informal conference.

The HAV Data Access Advisory Committee created by Section 15 is an important HAV policy initiative that must be addressed now. The need to create a forum to discuss issues such as access, use, privacy and ownership of data generated by HAVs is too important to leave to future legislation. Section 15 would guarantee that the discussion starts now, rather than years from now. The Section 15 Advisory Committee is comprised of a wide cross-section of HAV policy stakeholders to ensure all interests are considered with respect to these important policy discussions. Recommendations from the Section 15 Advisory Committee would be communicated to Congress within 30 months of enactment and would inform future efforts by Congress to address these important issues.

U.S. Senate Committee Approves Federal Advisory Committee Language

ASA Supports Data Access and Cybersecurity Amendment

WASHINGTON, D.C., October 4, 2017 – On October 4th, 2017, the U.S. Senate Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation adopted an amendment to establish a federal advisory committee comprised of aftermarket representatives and other stakeholders. The amendment, offered by U.S. Senator Inhofe (R-OK), was added to S. 1885, the American Vision for Safer Transportation Through Advancement of Revolutionary Technologies (AV START) Act.

Included in the scope of the Committee is a review of data access and cyber security issues. In consultation with National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) and the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), the Committee will produce a comprehensive report on vehicle data, intellectual property protections, customer privacy, cybersecurity, vehicle safety, etc., within two years.

In addition, the amendment requires the Government Accountability Office to conduct a study of the technologies currently available to remove data that may be personally identifiable or attributable to an individual from used vehicles upon their sale to a new owner or from leased or rented vehicles at the

Such report shall include recommendations regarding the ownership of, control of, or access to, information or data that vehicles collect, generate, record, or store in an electronic form that is retrieved from a highly automated vehicle or automated driving system, and may include minority views, if applicable.

- (B) CONSIDERATIONS.—When making any policy recommendations, the Committee shall give appropriate consideration to motor vehicle safety, intellectual property protections, compliance with requirements under the Motor Vehicle Safety Act, customer privacy, cybersecurity, confidential business information related to the mechanical or computer systems of such vehicles, public safety, and transportation planning. Recommendations should address—
 - (i) an owner's or registered user's personally identifiable information;
 - (ii) vehicle-generated data; and
 - (iii) vehicle interface capability.
 - (5) COMPENSATION.—Members of the Committee shall serve without compensation.
- (6) SUPPORT.—The Office of Rulemaking of the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and the Bureau of Consumer Protection of the Federal Trade Commission shall provide support services to the Committee.
- (7) TERMINATION.—The Committee shall terminate upon the submission of the report required under paragraph (4).
- (e) GAO STUDY ON REMOVAL OF PERSONAL DATA FROM VEHICLE INFORMATION SYSTEMS.—
 - (1) STUDY.—
- (A) IN GENERAL.—The Comptroller General of the United States shall conduct a study of the technologies currently available to remove data that may be personally identifiable or attributable to an individual from used motor vehicles upon their sale to a new owner or from leased or rented vehicles at the completion of the lease or rental contract.
- (B) UNIFORM DATA REMOVAL APPROACH.—The study conducted under subparagraph (A) shall assess the feasibility of adopting a uniform and simple approach across vehicle brands for the removal of data described in subparagraph (A) when a vehicle is sold or a lease or rental ends.
- (C) CONSULTATION.—In conducting the study under subparagraph (A), the Comptroller General shall consult with—
 - (i) vehicle manufacturers;
 - (ii) consumer groups;
- (iii) vehicle dealers, including representatives of the vehicle leasing and vehicle rental industry; and

- (iv) other stakeholders.
- (2) REPORT.—Not later than 1 year after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General of the United States shall submit a report to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation of the Senate and the Committee on Energy and Commerce of the House of Representatives that contains the result of the study conducted under subsection (a), including recommendations regarding—
 - (A) the feasibility of adopting a uniform data removal approach; and
- (B) legislative action that the Comptroller General may consider prudent and practicable for facilitating the consistent removal of data described in subparagraph (A).

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



Period Ending January 31, 2018

OVERVIEW

The financial statements are based on the Board approved 2018 budget. ASCCA uses the accrual method of accounting for financial reporting.

The operations of ASCCA for the Period Ending January 31, 2018 resulted in excess revenue over/(under) expenses of \$107,427 which is better than budget by \$1,367 after taxes.

The following statements are provided for Period Ending January 31, 2018:

- (1) ASCCA Consolidated Statement of Financial Position
- (2) ASCCA Consolidated Statement of Functional Activities

CONSOLIDATO STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL POSITION

CURRENT ASSETS:

Cash: All funds are kept in interest-bearing accounts whenever possible. Total cash balance for this reporting period is \$505,913 of which \$370,220 is being held in the Vanguard reserve account.

Investment Accounts (Vanguard): ASCCA operating investment policy calls for six months of operating reserves. Six months based on the current 2018 budget would be \$181,287 (\$30,215 monthly). Currently ASCCA has total cash in operating of \$505,913 less total current liabilities of \$51,680 a balance of \$454,233 which is 15.5 months of operating expenses. Realized gain/loss on investments is currently \$11,257 equal to budget.

FIXED ASSETS:

Building & Fixtures: No fixed assets have been added.

OTHER ASSETS:

Prepaid Expenses: Prepaid expenses are \$3,269 Projects in Progress: Projects in progress are \$73.

Future Tax Benefits: MBI's tax benefit which the CPA will review each year to ensure is correct.

CURRENT LIABILITIES:

Accounts Payable: Balance of Accounts Payable is \$33,893.

Other liabilities include: Advocacy Fund Contribution, currently the balance \$8,704.

Chapter Dues Payable: currently the balance is \$7,953.

California Wildfire Relief Fund: \$857.

LONG TERM LIABILITIES:

Tenant Lease Deposit: \$3,138 (increased from \$1,611.00 by \$1,527.00)

MEMBERS' EQUITY: Includes Capital Stock, Additional Paid in Capital, Retained Earning prior years and current year retained earnings.

CONSOLIDATED STATEMENT OF FUNCTIONAL ACTIVITIES

REVENUES: Total revenue is \$137,382 better than budget by \$368 (the revenue includes realized gain of \$11,257 on investments)

Membership Dues: Currently dues are \$113,375 equal than budget for this month.

Endorsements/Services: Revenue is \$3,187 equal to budget for this month.

ASCCA ESI Course Voucher: revenue is 190 with zero expenses.

Other Revenue - (includes miscellaneous revenue, and building rental) Revenue \$3,845 better than budget by \$368.

Technology Expenses are all expenses related to list service, systems maintenance, database updates and website changes and maintenance. Currently expenses are \$4,200 equal to budget for this month.

Publication/Communication – expenses are \$46 less than budget by \$17.

Board (Team Weekends) & Committee Expense includes items that are directly related to the committee and Team Weekends travel.

Meeting & Travel: \$232 in expenses for this month, better than budget by \$42.

Revenue & Benefit Committee: There are no expenses for this month, better than budget by \$292.

Governmental Affairs Committee: expenses are \$3,904 better than budget by \$846.

Membership Recruitment/Retention includes all expenses related to marketing of membership and the legal service provided as a membership benefit. Expenses are \$1,671 better than budget by \$75.


Public Relation Committee includes all expenses related to public relations projects. Expenses are zero better than budget by \$216.


General & Administrative expenses include all expenses for operations. Total of the expenses for operations are \$2,561 less than budget \$140.







Bylaws Article IV

Section: 4-02. Membership Categories: The ASCCA shall be comprised of different categories of membership, each of which shall be an organization, person, firm or association defined as follows. Membership categories may be further defined in policy adopted by the board of directors. Only members in good standing are eligible to vote or hold elective office.

- a. Regular members shall be automotive service businesses validly and currently registered in good standing with the California Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA) Bureau of Automotive Repair (BAR) as an Automotive Repair Dealer (ARD). Regular members shall be entitled to vote and shall be entitled to hold elective office.
- b. Associate members shall be those businesses, which supply goods, equipment or services to the automotive service/repair industry, and/or those automotive repair businesses, regardless of type. Associate members shall be entitled to vote and shall be entitled to hold elective office, as described in Article X: Board of Directors, Section 10-02 of this document.

c. Lifetime Honorary Members

- 1. Past Presidents of the ASCCA, upon completion of their term of office, shall be granted Lifetime Honorary Member status. Past Presidents will retain all the rights of a regular member including the ability to hold office as long as he/she maintains an active Automotive Repair Dealer (ARD) license.
- 2. Lifetime Honorary Membership may also be conferred upon individuals who have rendered efforts on behalf of the automotive service industry or the ASCCA that merit special recognition. This membership shall be confirmed by the affirmative vote of at least two-thirds of the current ASCCA Board of Directors. Without payment of dues, Lifetime Honorary members will not be entitled to vote or hold elective office.
- d. Educator members shall be teachers or administrators working in an accredited California school who do not own or manage an automotive repair facility. Educator members shall not be entitled to vote but shall be entitled to hold elective office.
- e. Retired members are those individuals who were a Regular member in good standing at the time of retirement. Retired members shall not be entitled to vote but shall be entitled to hold elective office.
- f. Technician members are those individuals who provide automotive repair services but do not have any proprietary interest in an automotive repair facility. Technician members shall not be entitled to vote or hold elective office.
- g. Student members are those individuals who are currently attending automotive training but do not work in an automotive repair facility. Student members shall not be entitled to vote or hold elective office.

- h. Branch members are defined as an additional location that is owned by the same owner as either a Regular member or Associate member. Branch members shall not be entitled to vote nor hold elective office.
- i. Out of State members shall be automotive service businesses validly and currently licensed or certified in the state in which it operates. Out of State members will not be entitled to vote or hold elective office.

Re: Facebook Closed Group & Promotion Strategy

I had been asked by Rocky Khamenian to work with my team to outline the benefits of a Facebook Group and how it could work in tandem with the existing TeamTalk list serve. Additionally, I wanted to provide the Board with some things to consider with respect to an overall social media strategy to promote ASCCA.

This memo represents a starting point for discussion. My recommendation is that the Board assign a task force to work with staff to develop an overall communications strategy. We believe that the association could benefit by making a limited financial investment into marketing the association to non-members via social media.

Facebook Group & TeamTalk

The Board initially decided to make the Facebook Group closed. However, I would recommend that the Board reconsider this position. We should consider an approach that the Facebook Group be open to all shop owners and employ some marketing, we could see an uptick in ASCCA's outreach, influence and membership.

If we were to keep the group closed, the question remains: How does the Facebook group work with TeamTalk? There are two approaches that we recommend considering:

- 1. Focusing on TeamTalk as a member benefit and using the Facebook group as like a "teaser" entry point would be a good strategy. As an example, I was in a very active women's entrepreneurial group on Facebook but to gain access to industry experts (more than a quick group posted question that might get buried among a ton of posts) you had to pay to be a part of the "club" on their members only website.
- 2. Keeping the Facebook group all ASCCA members and promoting it as a member benefit similar to TeamTalk. The key here is really getting the Board members who use Facebook to post in the group often so it's a variety of voices (not just Rocky) and a variety of post types (not just silly things). Also, encouraging members to invite other members to join the Facebook group is huge, since TeamTalk has a leg-up since new ASCCA members are automatically added to it as they join the association. The Facebook group would be an easier platform for Chapter Leaders to post upcoming event information with photos/flyer images as well (vs. trying to email it out on TeamTalk).

Up to 14,000,000 people could be reached with this audience.

Sarah set this audience to very general locations (all of California) and added all suggested interests and demographics just to see what Facebook could come up with, related to the automotive industry. Keeping these settings would allow of a reach of up to 270,000 of the 14,000,000 possible.

We can see the budget at any amount the ASCCA is comfortable with. Sarah recommends starting small and seeing what sort of traction we get, maybe \$100-\$200 for a 14-day promo (max reach of 49,000 people if we pay \$200 as compared to the highest organic reach we have which is less than 100 people) once we have solidified what exactly we'd like to promote. Keep in mind there are a variety of post image/graphic restrictions (i.e. not having too much text within the graphic) and post text restrictions.

Twitter:

Twitter has a different option available that promotes all your tweets (not re-tweets) out to a larger audience. We have had some success using this with another AMG client Twitter account. It's called Twitter Promote Mode and costs \$99 per month: https://business.twitter.com/en/help/twitter-promote-mode-help.html. According to Twitter - "accounts will reach 30,000 additional people and add 30 followers each month on average." which seems right in line with what we've seen for our other client. The other option available on Twitter is similar to post booting and creating ads on Facebook: https://ads.twitter.com/campaign/18ce546bxiw/new/campaign/objectivepicker via Twitter Ads. You start with a campaign objective:

- Website clicks or conversions
- Followers
- Awareness
- Tweet engagements
- Promoted video views

Here are the audience settings entered:

Unfortunately, Twitter won't provide an estimated audience reach. We can set the budget as daily or just a total budget and set the date range. Sarah suggest a similar promo strategy as with Facebook, max 14 days with a budget of \$100-\$200.

Note: The demographics and audience settings chosen were based on finds when typing automotive related keywords and some of the twitter accounts for organization that support the ASCCA. If there are any specific keywords or Twitter accounts we should add or change, we can finetune the list.

Re: September Team Weekend Event

The Board of Directors previously directed staff to look at a location in San Diego for the September Team Weekend. John Eppstein helped to connect us with Brad McCombs the Cuyamaca College Automotive Program Coordinator. Brad is a very avid supporter of ASCCA and welcomed the opportunity to invite us to hold our event at the campus.

There are a few details to consider with respect to dates and format. The college can host us on Friday and Saturday. The campus is closed Sunday. Therefore, we need to decide if we want to hold a Team Weekend with committee meetings or a condensed weekend with Chapter Representatives Committee and Board of Directors meetings on Saturday.

For Friday, Brad will work with the local colleges and high schools to host a collaborative day between industry and the schools to discuss the degree program and student job placement. He is a huge advocate of requiring job placement be with ASCCA member shops only. This would be a full-day event and would likely also include a tour of the school. The only caveat is that he did note that the local high schools start that same week, which may or may not pose a problem with their participation.

If we decide that we want to meet on Sunday, we will look at securing meeting space at a local hotel, which may present some additional expense.

Overall, the Cuyamaca College offer presents a great opportunity for ASCCA to accomplish one of its main goals for 2018 to assist Chapter 24 with its tech degree program and helping to expand it on a state-wide basis.
